1. Mayor Kourianos called the regular meeting to order at 5:32 p.m. Pastor Andrew Lasslo with New Life Church offered a word.
2. Mayor Kourianos led the Pledge of Allegiance.
3. Roll was called with the above Councilmembers and staff in attendance.
4. PUBLIC COMMENT – Mathew Sorensen asked the Mayor and Council if they were working towards a structured and measured process regarding downtown/Main Street. He expressed numerous concerns. The Mayor informed Mr. Sorensen a committee was created two years ago and they were working towards the downtown/Main Street project. The Mayor invited Mr. Sorensen to the next committee meeting and also extended an invitation for him to be part of the committee. Nick Tatton invited Mr. Sorensen to contact him and he would give him meeting details.
5. SAFETY SECONDS – Councilmember Davis reminded everyone to change the batteries in their safety devices. Pick a specific day and every year change the batteries in all the safety devices in your home.
6. SOUTHEASTERN UTAH JR. LIVESTOCK SHOW - Request for sponsorship.  
The SEUJLS is working towards their 2022 livestock show. The Mayor and Council discussed the value of this program for the youth in both Emery and Carbon counties.  
**MOTION.** Councilmember Christman moved to approve a \$250 sponsorship for the Southeastern Utah Jr Livestock Show. Motion seconded by Councilmember Knott-Jespersen and carried.
7. PRICE CITY YOUTH COUNCIL PROJECT - Consideration and possible approval of the Price City Youth Council's Asian Bistro Fundraiser to waive the auditorium fees for a movie to be held Saturday, January 29, 2022 at 7:00 P.M. in the Price City auditorium.  
Mayor Kourianos reviewed the project. This project sends a message that Price City and Price City Youth Council cares about Price City businesses and their employees.  
**MOTION.** Councilmember Davis moved to waive the auditorium fees. Motion seconded by Councilmember Marsing and carried.
8. ORDINANCE NO. 2022-002 - Consideration and possible approval to adopt "AN ORDINANCE OF PRICE CITY, UTAH, ADOPTING A POLICY TO PROTECT PRIVACY BY GOVERNING CAMERA USE IN AREAS OF PUBLIC FACILITIES; AND ESTABLISHING AN EFFECTIVE DATE".  
**MOTION.** Councilmember Davis moved to strike this item from the agenda allowing for further discussion with legal counsel and staff. Motion seconded by Councilmember Christman and carried.

11. RIGHT-OF-WAY DEDICATION - Consideration and possible approval of the Right-of-Way Dedication for the proposed Main Street Sewer Expansion Project which joins the sewer line in Main Street (at Airport Road) to the one in Nick Lane.

**MOTION.** Councilmember Miller moved to remove Item 11 from the agenda for further discussion. Motion seconded by Councilmember Marsing and carried.

13. AGREEMENT BETWEEN UTAH STATE LIBRARY AND PRICE CITY LIBRARY FOR DIGITAL CONTENT IN OVERDRIVE - Consideration and possible approval for the Price City Library to continue the agreement with the Utah State Library for the use of OverDrive which provides digital media content for Library Patrons.

14. YOUTH ORCHESTRA - Consideration and possible approval to wave the Price City Auditorium fees for practices and a concert.

**MOTION.** Councilmember Miller moved to remove Item 14 from the agenda for further discussion. Motion seconded by Councilmember Christman and carried.

Councilman Miller reviewed the request. He is currently working with the youth orchestra. He also worked with them last year. They practice during the week and are not charged any fees. He is requesting the auditorium fee waived for the concert.

**MOTION.** Councilmember Miller moved to wave the auditorium fee for a concert. Motion seconded by Councilmember Knott-Jespersen and carried.
