1. Mayor Kourianos called the regular meeting to order at 5:30 p.m. Reverend Michael Nelson with Trinity Christian Center offered a word.
2. Mayor Kourianos led the Pledge of Allegiance.
3. Roll was called with the above Councilmembers and staff in attendance. Councilmember Marsing was excused.
4. SAFETY SECONDS – Councilmember Christman noted that Saturday, April 30, 2022 is National Prescription Drug Take Back Day. As part of the special event, the Price Police Department is participating in “Clean Out Your Medicine Cabinet”, an effort to dispose of unused prescription and over-the-counter medications. The drop-off location is the Price City Fire Department. “Clean Out Your Medicine Cabinet” is an effort by the Utah Department of Environmental Quality and the University of Utah Poison Control Center, along with numerous partners to reduce the problems caused by unused medications. This is a safe way to clean out your medicine cabinet and dispose of items safely.
5. PUBLIC COMMENT - No comment was received on any item.
6. MASTER MUNICIPAL CLERK AWARD - Presentation of the International Institute of Municipal Clerks' Master Municipal Clerk designation to the City Recorder by Colleen Mulvey, President of the Utah Municipal Clerks Association.  
President Colleen Mulvey and Board Members of the Utah Municipal Clerks Association, presented a plaque acknowledging the Master Municipal Clerk designation to Sherrie Gordon, the Price City Recorder.
7. PRICE BOYS & GIRLS CLUB - A groups of teens will propose a plan to bring awareness to the substance abuse in our community.  
Club Director Quakee Tabone and members of the Boys & Girls Club provided a presentation on substance abuse in our community. The Mayor and Council thanked the club members for the valuable information.
8. PACIFIC SOUTHWEST REGIONAL BASEBALL TOURNAMENT - Consideration and possible approval of a \$1,000 sponsorship requested by Jill Emerson, Tournament Director.  
Tournament Director Jill Emerson will bring two Babe Ruth League regional baseball tournaments to Price. The tournaments will be held July 24-30, 2022. Teams will be coming in from Arizona, California, Hawaii, and Nevada. There will be 12 teams in each age group with eight and thirteen year old players. Each age group costs \$3,000. These tournaments will bring in approximately 1,500 people to Price over the week. She requested a \$1,000 sponsorship to help with the tournaments.
