1. Mayor Kourianos called the regular meeting to order at 5:31 p.m. Pastor Bob Wells with First Baptist Church offered a word.
2. Mayor Kourianos led the Pledge of Allegiance.
3. Roll was called with the above Councilmembers and staff in attendance.
4. SAFETY SECONDS – Mayor Kourianos stated he was proud of the Price City Police Department for their continued service to the community. They are watching out for people in crosswalks and all pedestrians. They are keeping citizens safe.
5. PUBLIC COMMENT – David Jelin, Commander of the American Legion Post 3, addressed the Mayor and City Council. He reviewed the legion's Memorial Day ceremonies schedules for Price, Helper and Wellington cemeteries. He encourages everyone to volunteer to help place flags on Veteran's graves. Come out and support the Veterans and Memorial Day. A flag retirement ceremony will be held on Flag Day, June 14, 2022.

8. PROCLAMATION: PRICE CITY PUBLIC WORKS WEEK 2022 - Consideration and possible approval for the Mayor to declare May 15-21, 2022 as Price City Public Works Week 2022.

Miles Nelson reviewed the proclamation and expressed appreciation for the Public Works employees and for the support of the officials at Price City. The Mayor and City Council thanked the Public Works employees for a job well done. Mayor Kourianos read aloud the proclamation.
